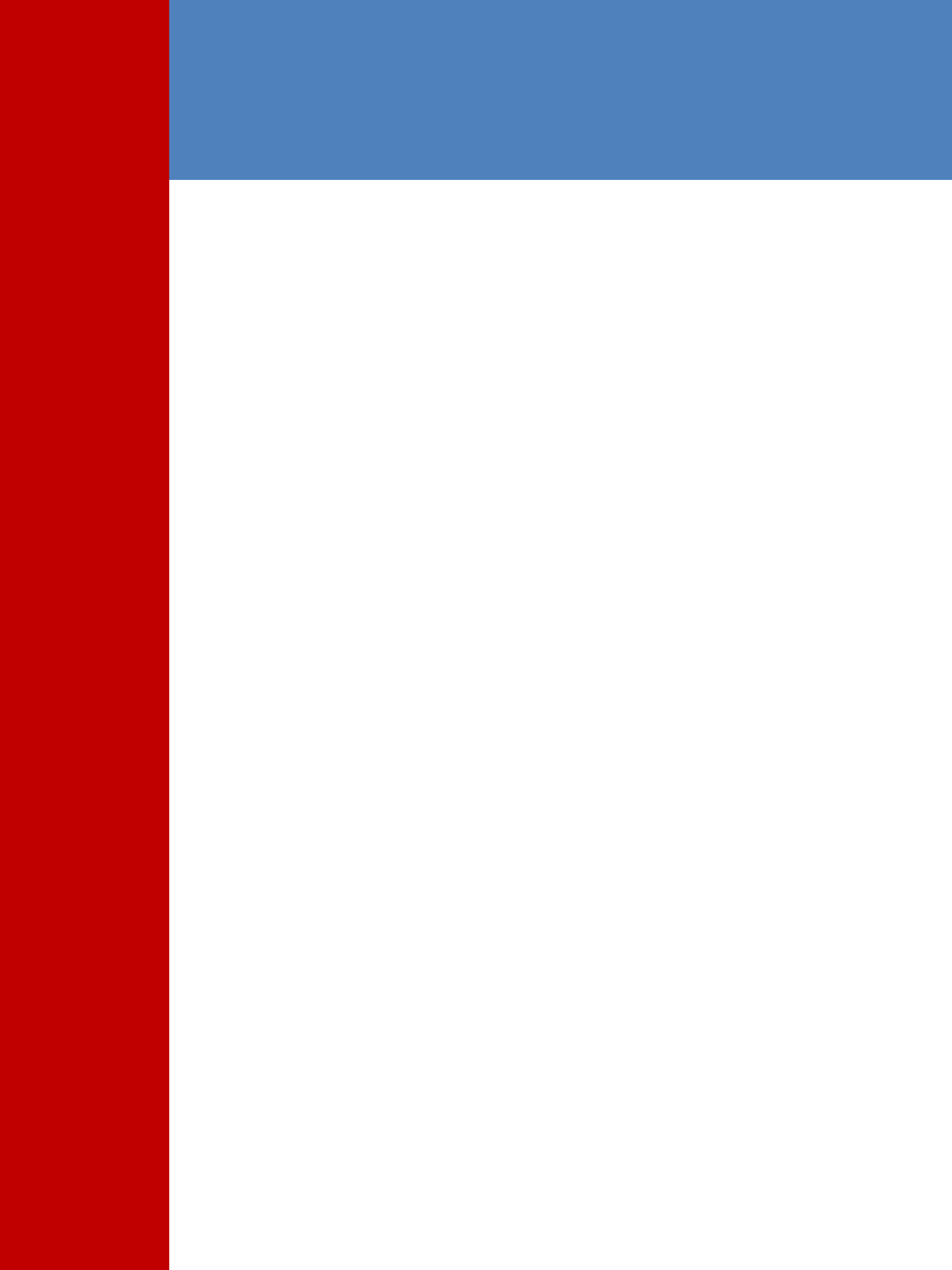


The Wolf and the Ass
